Artist Bio: Sabahtage

"Sabahtage Your Wall"

Sabah, AKA 'Sabahtage' has been a huge fan and supporter of BurgerFreak, going right back to the pop-up days.... She originally visited BurgerFreak as 'the better half of '@Burger Snobs' (Check it out on Instagram!) and from the first visit she knew this place was special... She was so inspired she designed an A3 sized drawing full of horror images, pop culture nods as well as perfect personal touches specific to BurgerFreak. It was this original drawing that became the basis for the eventual mural that you see in-store today; and was the beginning of the friendship between the Freaks and the Snobs.

Sabahtage had always wanted to design/create murals herself and have them up on walls. She is a local Belmont girl and loved adding a bit of her 'hood' to one of her favourite Burger joints by the addition of her mural with all its local references hidden in plain sight. Artistry runs in the family for Sabahtage, as her mother is also an artist with a Diploma of Fine Art. Sabahtage's art has always been finely detailed. She has always 'sabahtaged', her art, whether it be shoes, dolls, masks, cd's, herself, anything she could, along with fashion design, cards, and art for friends and as gifts, or as commission work. Sabahtage's artistic skills and love for creativity have obviously been inherited from her Mum – although their genres of art are very different, they however both have the same tastes in the general aspects of what they find mystical and wondrous. She loves cryptic art where she takes delight in connecting bits and pieces from a world of places, into her art and she was very much inspired by books through childhood that involve a lot of clutter and chaos, but that still made a lot of sense such as, "Where's Wally?", written by Martin Handford, and among others, the beautifully presented "I Spy" books, written by Jean Marzollo. This love for the cryptic and chaotic is evident in her work, with so many details,

puns, inside jokes and designs dotted throughout the BurgerFreak mural, there is always something new to discover!

Her art presents on many levels, there are meaning behind meanings, references of references, obvious and obscure. Jokes and puns, plays on words. The longer you look, you will realise that there is more than meets the eye, and Sabahtage hopes that everyone finds something they like, something they remember, and something they know in her mural.
